

Creating a Trial Bra Cup Mold

Sculpting a Bra Sloper Mold is a technique that may be new to you. These instructions show you how to do a trial run to explore the techniques before you do the real thing. If you are working with a helper to create a bra sloper mold for yourself, I suggest you try this trial run with your helper so that you can both discuss the process.

Actually the technique isn't that different from working with papier-mâché. Except instead of waiting for the binder to dry, masking tape can be layered and trimmed immediately.

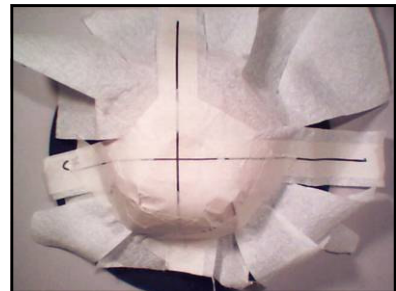
This example shows working with half a grapefruit. But actually it is best if you can find a fruit or object that is as close as possible to the shape and size of the breast that you are making a mold for. The first photo below shows a domed cover for an iced coffee drink to the right of the grapefruit.



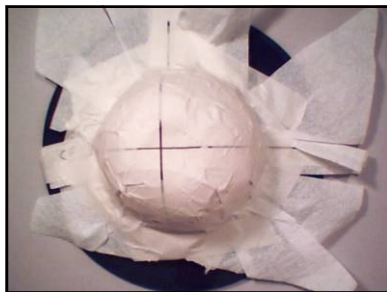
1. Select the object to be covered.



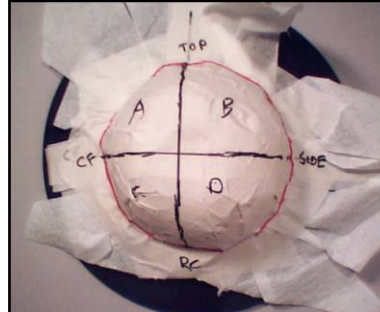
2. Prepare a paper towel as described on page 18.



3. Start adhering masking tape to the towel to capture the shape.



4. Tape the entire shape until there is no towel showing.



5. Mark the "bra cup" as shown above.



6. Trim off the excess towel.
